1. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order by JoAnne Race, Board President, at 6:15 pm. She asked all to stand for the pledge of allegiance after a moment of silence was observed.

2. Executive Session

Motion made by Jan Woodworth, seconded by Jennifer Parmalee to move into Executive Session.

➤ Vote: 7 (in favor) 0 (opposed) Motion passed.

The Board moved into Executive Session at 6:15 pm.

Motion made by Ron Luteran, seconded by Jan Woodworth to return to Public Session.

➤ Vote: 7 (in favor) 0 (opposed) Motion passed.

The Board returned to Public Session at 6:35 pm.

3. Discussion Items

- 1. Chris DiFulvio: the target average elementary class size is 23 students. The 2023 strategic plan was used to reflect what the community deemed as priorities for the school district in tonight's presentation.
- 2. Tom Finnerty: the governor is proposing a 4.8% increase in total school aid this year, among other items. Expenditures always outpace revenue. Looked back 5, 10 and 15 years for average data and created a long-term forecast.
- 3. JoAnne Race: add to slide 57: what will fund balance look like over the next 5 years as we spend it, plus the % average of what to put back each year.
- 4. March 25: school budget community dialogue night; need to reschedule Burton Street open house. Any discussion of merger should not be entwined with this budget presentation.
- 5. Ron Luteran: Tom's wealth ratio presentation at the January regular board meeting was impactful.
- 6. Judith Hight: we never hear criticism of the library budget, which is on the ballot.
- 7. The board collectively advised to forego the survey this year.
- 8. Meghan Kelly: has been reiterating sentiment from Albany at her business, essentially "don't come to Albany and ask for more money until your community contributes more" and seen positive response from that.

- 9. JoAnne: 29% of our population is over the age of 65, not invested as much as those with children in the school. Will the tax cap change again?
- 10. Tom: the tax cap is pretty much settled now; aid ratios increased by 0.7% because the wealth ratio decreased slightly. Presented the option to use debt service to lower the tax cap.
- 11. Chris: asked the board if anyone wants to cut programming, the board collectively said no.
- 12. Ron: thinks we have a shot at getting a super majority needed to go above the tax cap.
- 13. Travis Barr: important to see where we are and where we're going; not in fiscal distress but could be soon, and Tom's five year long-term projections show a plan to avoid that.
- 14. Jan Woodworth: appreciated that the strategic plan, vision and mission statements were used to guide the budget and tonight's presentation.
- 15. Tom/Chris: might need to have another spending freeze this year, will confer with the District Treasurer.
- 16. Travis: asked for talking points when approached by members of the community; Chris will provide these for all board members and the admin team.

The next regular meeting will be held on Monday, February 10, 2025 at 6:30 p.m. The next special meeting (budget work session #2) will be held on Monday, March 10, 2025 at 6:30 p.m.
