
Restorative Practices

Goals of Restorative Practices

- create healthy relationships between students and faculty
- 2. foster a sense of belonging
- 3. foster common understanding of the impact of our behavior
- 4. create a way for us to learn from our mistakes
- 5. seek to repair harm done to relationships
- 6. attend to the needs of persons harmed and the school community as a whole

Restorative Practices Defined

"The fundamental hypothesis of restorative practices is that human beings happier, more cooperative and productive, and more likely to make positive changes in their behavior when those in positions of authority do things with them, rather than to them or for them" (Costello, Wachtel & Wachtel).
